## Lilly Ledbetter

Grace and Grit: How I Won My Fight  
at Goodyear and Beyond

Tuesday, March 20, 7:30 p.m.

After 19 years as a successful supervisor at Goodyear, Lilly Ledbetter suspected she wasn't getting paid as much as male counterparts. When this was confirmed, she brought an Equal Employment Opportunity Commission Complaint against Goodyear, and won. However, the company appealed and the ruling was overturned by the Supreme Court. This decision motivated legal groups and politicians, and on January 29, 2009, the Lilly Ledbetter Fair Pay Act was the first act of Congress signed by President Obama—making it easier for women who have experienced pay discrimination to fight back.
